Support the Parish - *A donation is worth more with Gift Aid*

Gift Aid is a simple way for our parish to increase the value of donations we receive from parishioners who are UK taxpayers. The parish can reclaim tax on what you as a UK taxpayer donate to the parish, if and only if, you allow us to do so.

Making a donation under Gift Aid will enable the parish to reclaim the basic rate of tax on your donation - money on which you have already paid tax. This means that if you give £10 under Gift Aid we will receive £12.50 - £10 from you and £2.50 from HM Revenue and Customs.

To join our Gift Aid Scheme you or a member of your family need:

- To be a tax payer. This can be tax on salary, pensions, company dividends and even income from building society interest. All these are income on which you pay tax and the Parish can reclaim on your donations under the Gift Aid Scheme.

- To give your Offertory collection, and any other donation, in a way which can be recorded - by weekly envelopes, standing order or both.
- To complete and return the attached Gift Aid Declaration giving your permission for the Parish to re-claim tax. It is your money and the tax man is happy for us to claim it back.

That is all. It is as simple as that!

- we don't want to know how much you earn
- or how much tax you pay
- or where your money comes from
- we just need to know that you **do** pay tax

The Gift Aid Declaration can be cancelled at any time by informing the Parish in writing.

*If you have previously signed a Gift Aid Declaration Form you do **not** need to complete following Gift Aid Declaration .*
